Mrs. Flores's First Grade class!!



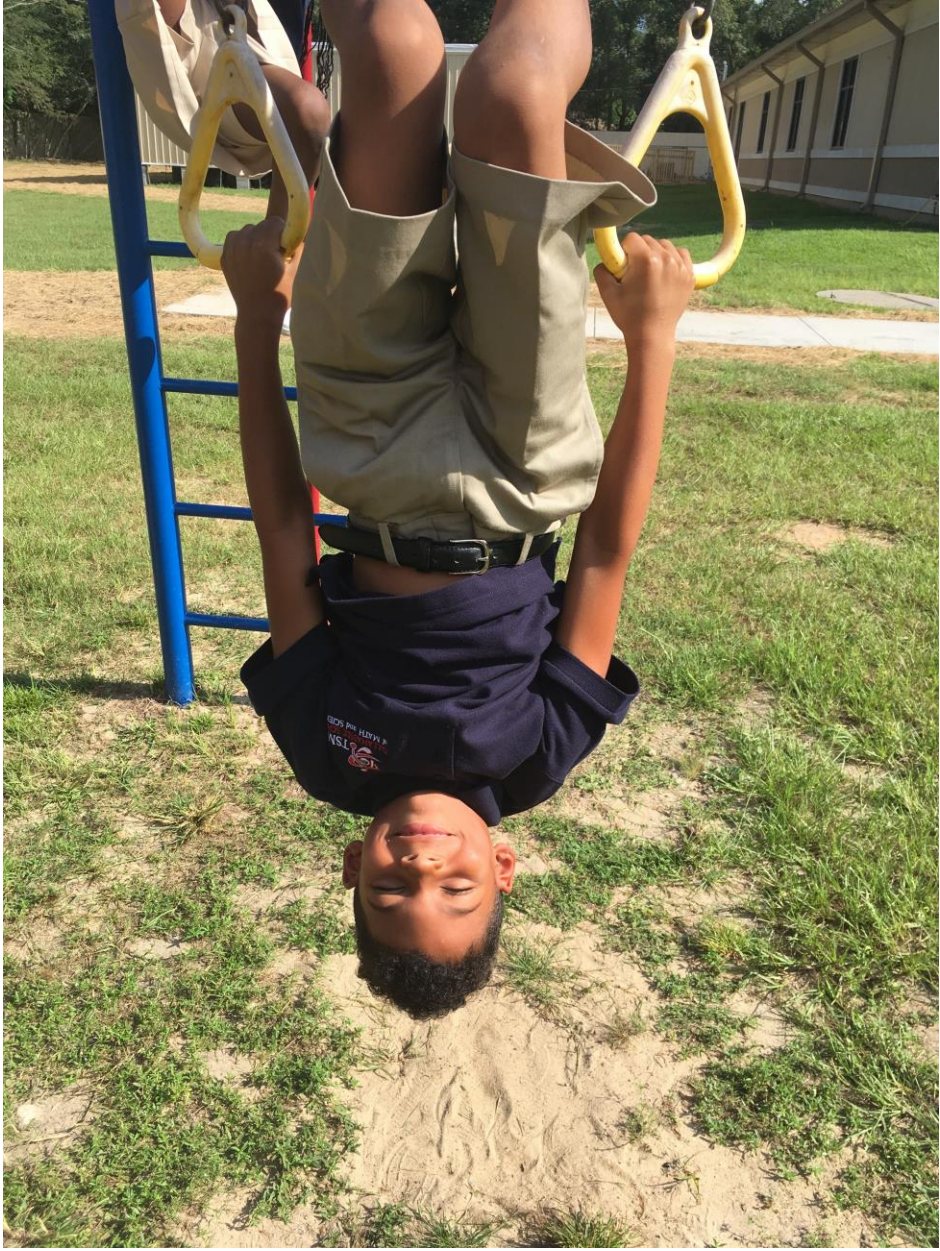

Dear parents:

Welcome! My name is Stephanie Esparza Lorenzo. I am the fifth-grade teacher for this school year 2017-2018.

I would like to thank all the parents that came to the orientation on Thursday, August 10th. I am excited to work with all of you.

Breakfast: Have breakfast every day. The school provides free breakfast starting at 7:30am.

Lunch: I highly promote healthy foods for lunch: fruits, vegetables, cereals, oatmeal cookies, juice low in sugar or no sugar added, etc. Water bottles are welcome to prevent class interruptions. However, student should make sure that this does not become a distraction.

Clothing: Bring sweater and appropriate clothes for air conditioner. Students are to wear school approved uniform wear.

Homework: Students will be required to read a minimum of 20min. daily. Student will turn in Reading Logs every Monday.

Cell phones: Cellphones are to be turned off while on campus.

This week, we will concentrate on discussing classroom rules and procedures. The student is to follow the class procedures to ensure that there are no interruptions to the learning process. We will rehearse the procedures and rules every day for the first week.

Behavior management: The student will be provided a think sheet and will lose points. Think sheet must be signed by parent and brought in the next day.

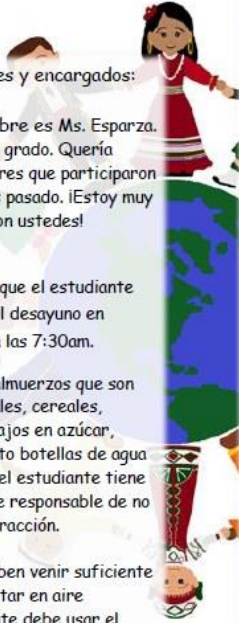
Algunos de los procedimientos que se discutirán son los siguientes:

8th Grade Summer Reading Projects!



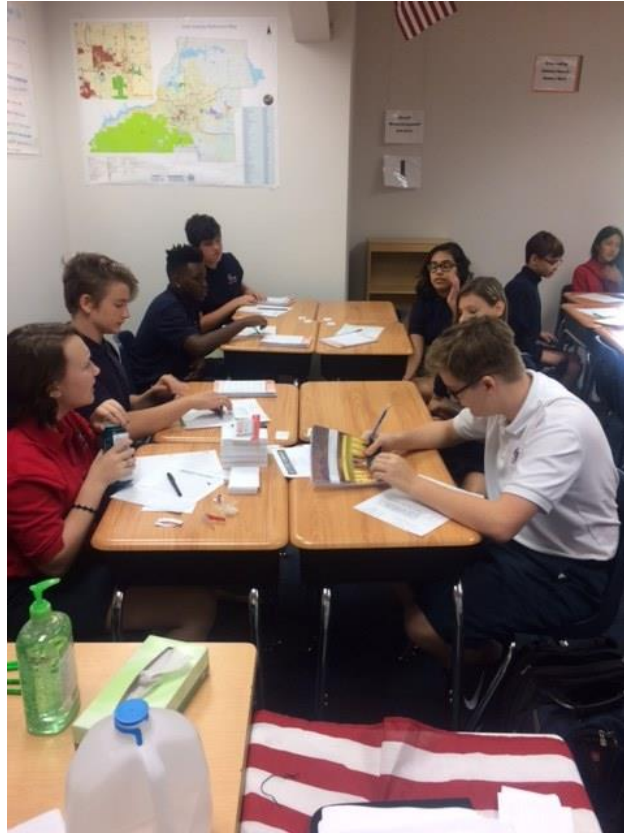

CANCELLATION OF ECLIPSE VIEWING

Dear TSMS Families,

As you all know TSMS planned to have a Solar Eclipse viewing on August 21st at 2:30 PM.

In order to have a safe viewing, TSMS purchased viewing glasses.
